

## PUBLIC HEALTH TECHNICIAN

Schenectady County Public Health Services is seeking a Public Health Technician to work in the Environmental Health Unit. This position is responsible for working with Public Health Sanitarians to determine compliance with local and State Sanitary Code requirements and carrying out various elements of prevention and control programs affecting public health.

Candidates should also possess a working knowledge of basic principles and practices related to proper environmental public health inspection techniques and a working knowledge of applicable provisions of the local and State Sanitary Code related to environmental public health inspections.

Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with an Bachelor's Degree including a minimum of fifteen (15) semester credit hours in the natural sciences, of which not more than six (6) credit hours may be in applied sciences is required; OR

Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with an Associate's Degree including a minimum of fifteen (15) semester credit hours in the natural sciences, of which not more than six (6) credit hours may be in applied sciences; and two years' experience in environmental health; hydrogeology; biology; chemistry; physics; or epidemiology.
