



AOT/EVA Coordinator

The Position

Schenectady County is currently recruiting for a **Full Time AOT/EVA Coordinator**. This position exists in the Schenectady County Public Health Department and is responsible for supporting the County Behavioral Health Coordinator in administering the Assisted Outpatient Treatment and Enhanced Voluntary Agreement (AOT/EVA) program. The goal of this program is to improve engagement in community-based behavioral health treatment for individuals with serious mental illness who have a documented pattern of treatment non-adherence and related deterioration. The AOT/EVA Coordinator will seek to reduce psychiatric hospitalizations, emergency room use, criminal legal involvement, homelessness, and other crisis-driven outcomes, promote public safety and individual stability through coordinated outpatient service delivery and active care management. The incumbent will ensure use of the least restrictive intervention appropriate to the individual's presentation, including use of EVA as diversion from petitioning or as a step-down from court-ordered treatment when clinically appropriate and create a clear county-level infrastructure for referral, investigation, petitioning, service coordination, monitoring, significant event review, transfers, and quality assurance.

NOTE: This position will be part of the NYS HELPS Program and a Civil Service examination may not be required. Candidates can be eligible for consideration by meeting the minimum qualifications

Qualifications

Candidates must possess the following minimum qualifications to be considered:

- Possession of a Bachelor's degree in Social Work, Public Health, Human Services, Psychology, Criminal Justice, or closely related field, and three (3) years of experience working in behavioral health, care coordination, case management, or a related human services field.

Special Requirements

Possession of a valid New York State driver's license is required at the time of appointment and must be maintained throughout employment.

Salary

The annual salary for this position will be \$61,904 (JC5)
