



Caseworker (Glendale Home)

The Position

The **Schenectady County Glendale Nursing Home** has an opportunity for a part-time **Caseworker (Glendale Home)***. This position exists in Glendale Home and involves the responsibility for providing case-work services to residents and their families to aid them in dealing with medically related social and emotional problems. An employee in this position serves as a member of an interdisciplinary healthcare team involving medical, dietary, rehabilitation, and activities personnel in identifying needs and formulating and implementing the restorative and discharge potential of residents. Employees in this position are expected to consult and cooperate with professionals and other disciplines and agencies to aid them in recognizing the significant social components of healthcare and understanding the impact on residents and their families. The work is performed under the direct supervision of the Director of Resident and Family Services in accordance with facility policy and state and federal regulations. The incumbent does related duties as required.

NOTE: This is a Civil Service tested position and all candidates must pass a Civil Service examination when exam is next offered.

Qualifications

Candidates must possess the following minimum qualifications to be considered:

- A. Possession of a bachelor's degree and at least two (2) years of experience providing social work services in a nursing home; OR
- B. Possession of an associate's degree and at least four (4) years of experience providing social work services in a nursing home; OR
- C. An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of (A), and (B) above.

When college education is required to meet the minimum qualifications, a college transcript OR a copy of your diploma (may be an unofficial copy that clearly shows college name, degree/credits, etc...) must accompany the application for examination or application will be disapproved.

Salary

The salary range for this position is \$31.86/hr.—\$37.67/hr.
